EARLY LIFE

January 1900

- youngest among his six siblings
- Took to India Independence movement when he was a teenager

REVOLUTIONARY ACTIVITIES – KAKORI CONSPIRACY

- One of the revolutionaries pulled the emergency chain to stop the train and subsequently overpowered the guard.
- They looted that specific train because it was supposedly carrying money bags in the guard's cabin - the money bags allegedly belonged to India and was being transferred to the British government Treasury.
- They looted only these bags containing more than 100, 000 rupees and escaped to Lucknow
- He wanted to move abroad to further help the freedom struggle. He took the help of one of his friend who in turn betrayed him by informing the police about his whereabouts

TRIAL AND MARTYRDOM

December 1927

- He was detained in the Faizabad jail and a case was filed against him. The case for the Kakori dacoity was concluded by awarding death sentence to Khan.

SUMMARY

Organized and led the Kakori Conspiracy - a train robbery that took place between Kakori and, near Lucknow, on 9 August 1925 during the Indian Independence Movement against the British Indian Government.
