He was one of the key organisers of the Ghadar Mutiny and later the Indian National Army.

Rash Behari Bose handed over Indian National Army to Subhas Chandra Bose.

## EARLY LIFE

1886

- Rash Behari Bose was born in Bardhawan, West Bengal. Although he was more interested in revolutionary activities, he earned a degree in medical science and engineering

## REVOLUTIONARY ACTIVITIES

1916

- He was one of the key organisers of Ghadar revolution that aimed to attack the British army from the inside
- He helped in activating an uprising amongst the Indian masses and also played a crucial role in organising the Indian National Army (Azad Hind Fauj).
- He performed a key role in establishing the Indian Independence League.
- He attempted to assassinate Lord Hardinge by throwing a bomb at his parade in Delhi on December 23, 1912
- He escaped from India in 1915 and lived in Japan as a refugee. In 1943, he handed over the charge of Azad Hind Fauj to Subhas Chandra Bose

## LAST PHASE OF LIFE

1945

- The Japanese government had honoured him with the 'Order of the Rising Sun'. He died in Tokyo in 1945.
